

2016 Quilt Show Challenge: Cow-Moose Challenge

Challenge 2016 has been inspired by the marvelous Cow Quilts* displayed at our 2015 Quilt Show. Our challenge will be to make either a cow or a moose quilt using Mary Lou Weidman's patterns and have a title involving a pun.

Mary Lou has provided some puns with her patterns but feel free to invent your own. A pun is a "joke exploiting the different possible meanings of a word or the fact that there are words that sound alike but have different meanings."

- Size: Finished quilt shall be no smaller than 26"wide X 36"tall. You can make it as large as you want.
- Must use one of Mary Lou Weidman's patterns, either from her book, (Out of the Box with Easy Blocks) or the patterns provided by the guild for \$12.50.
- Quilt must be turned in for judging by Tuesday March 15th. – Details to be provided later.

Judging will be in 3 categories:

- Quilt that best interprets the show theme of "Quilts for All Seasons"
- 2. Best quilt with the worst, (i.e. funniest) pun (Mary Lou has provided some ideas
- Most outrageously funny quilt



Ms. Romatka, who lives in Bellevue, has gained a reputation in the Northwest as a teacher and fiber artist; it has spread across the country with the publication of her book, Creative Crafts of the World: she will come to the Tri-Cities in August after a gig at the New Image England Weavers' Seminars.

Her lessons are informed by her background in biochemistry, which is built on sequential steps. And her artistry derives from her awe at "how peoples from all over the world decorated the everyday things around them, how they made the useful things in their lives beautiful."

She believes that acquiring the traditional techniques that makers have used through the ages "grounds us" – connects us to other people in other times and other places. Folk art makes "opportunities to start discussions on geography, history, sociology, and more." The process of creating ethnic craft is a perfect antidote to the fast pace and homogeneity of our electronic age.

COMMUNITY SERVICE BLOCK JULY-AUGUST 2015

Fox Face- 9.5" X 10.5" UNfinished

Funny fox faces in many colors. Background fabrics to be furnished or use your own.

Cutting Instructions:

- Face: any bright color, from your own fabrics
- One square at 2.5" for the nose
- One rectangle at 2.5" x 6.5" for the forehead
- Background: tans, creams, taupes, offwhites from the kits or your own
- One rec. at 2.5" x 6.5" for between the ears
- Two squares at 3.5" for outside the muzzle
- Two rec. at 2" x 6.5" for the top & bottom frames
- Two rec. at 2" x 10.5 for the side frames
- Cheeks: browns, from kits or your own
- Two squares at 2.5"
- Nose tip: black
- One rec. at 1.5" x 6.5" USE TRIMMINGS FOR EYES

Fold or mark the ear squares and muzzle-background squares diagonally.

Lay out all cut pieces as shown in Pic1.

Sewing Instructions:

Add the 2.5" ear squares RST to the ends of the 2.5 x 6.5" background rec, sew on the diagonal, flip and trim away the back pieces.

Add the two brown cheek pieces to both sides of the face nose.

Add the black nose strip to the bottom of the face nose.

Add the muzzle-background 3.5" squares to the nose section with the same sew diagonal, flip and trim procedure (see Pic 2)

Sew all 6.5"-wide pieces together, pressing seams up. Top frame to ear section, add forehead, then nose section, then bottom frame.

Add the 2"x 10.5" background outside side pieces.

Use your scraps from the black nose tip to make ¾" eyes, appliquéd as you wish. Place just above and outside the seams for the nose/cheeks.

BOARD BRIEFS

May 2015

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by President Elaine Brouillard. Board Secretary Laurel Sutton took the minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Andrea Melius was absent. The Board was advised that the check to Three Rivers Convention Center has not yet been received; Laurel and Andrea will respond.

Retreat: Elaine reported four "sewists" had a productive and relaxing time at Spring Retreat.

Membership: Ginny Hildreth reported that 256 members have renewed memberships for 2015.

Sisters Bus Trip: While the Sisters Bus Trip has been cancelled due to insufficient turnout, members may attend on their own and reserve their own hotel rooms through the block claimed by the Guild.

Newsletter: Cynthia reported that recent processing changes at the USPS are delaying snail mail newsletters.

Quilt Show: 2016 Guest artists will be Dee Brown and Robin Halliday from The Quilted Trillium. The Committee needs to find volunteers to handle publicity, frame set-up and take-down. The Board approved payment for invoices for quilt pin design services and publicity expenses.

Community Service: After discussion, SIGN has been added to the Community Service list as an approved recipient for donation quilts.

AM/PM Programs: May program will be Prepping Your Quilt for a Longarmer, while June will cover Four Corners/curved piecing. August will be a Community Service program.

Workshops: Floreine Turlington reported low turnout for spring workshops. The Board discussed timing and breadth of workshop offerings; Floreine announced that, due to a new job, she will have less time to volunteer.

Liasons to Other Groups: The Board approved the Guild's participation in Uncommon Threads, a new fiber arts show held in Prosser.

June 2015

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by President Elaine Brouillard. Board Secretary Laurel Sutton took the minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Andrea Melius, Treasurer, reported that ending balances for the month of January are:

Checking \$14,058.03Savings \$4997.96Money Market \$20,005.72

Andrea reported the sale of quilt show pins recouped a little over half the investment; two recent workshops have also run in the red. Workshop enrollments have been difficult, as the workshop registration form is not clear. Cynthia Ewer volunteered to create a new form template.

Membership: Ginny reported current membership is approximately 260, explained that the drop of about 100 is due to the fact that, in the past, nonpaid names were not purged from the list. Ellen proposed dropping the requirement that Guild name tags be made from the current fan pattern. The Board discussed alternatives, but no action was taken.

Newsletter/Webmaster: Cynthia Ewer reported ongoing issues with the Web site have prevented updates; she is working with Velocity Webworks to resolve the issue.

Quilt Show: The Guild Challenge will use Mary Lou Weidman's patterns for a cow or a moose (\$12.50) to create a quilt with a punning title.

Community Service: Cyndy Underwood reported that 75 quilts have gone out; 1/3rd of our goal. Royal Quilters will donate 40 additional quilts to Royal Family Camp shortly. August meeting will be a Mile-A-Minute Social.

Retreat: Elaine has booked Fall Retreat to Ascension Center in Cover for October 7-11; Spring Retreat will be held in Ephrata..

Workshops: Floreine resigned her position as Workshop Chair due to the demands of a new job. Laurel will fill in for August workshops. A new Workshops Chair is needed!


Mark your calendars! The TCQG Fall Retreat has been scheduled for October 7-11 at the Ascension School Camp and Conference Center in Cove, Oregon.
