Quilts of Valor Presented at 2016 Show



The Tri-City Quilters' Guild hosted a Quilts of Valor presentation on April 2nd during our 33rd Annual Quilt Show. Five local military veterans were presented with beautiful "star spangled" quilts. Retired Major John Cole (Army) and Mick Hemphill (Navy) made the presentations assisted by their wives Vicki Cole and Linda Hemphill, photographers.

The veteran recipients were John Keaveney, husband of Jean Keaveney; Tom Brun, husband of Karen Brun; Don Merhar, husband of Debi Merhar of Quiltmania Quilt Shop; Arthur Melius, brother of Andrea Melius, and Jake Jacobsen, local veteran family.

Our appreciation goes to Judy Main, Judy Lyon, Andrea Melius, Debbie Trevino, Jan Greenwell, Roxie Ross, the "Sew What" friendship group, as well as several other members of the Guild who worked to create these special quilts.

The Quilts of Valor organization sent their thanks to the Guild for the opportunity to make this presentation at the Show.

The Quilts of Valor presentation was an exciting moment during the show, and the Guild was pleased to honor our veterans. Many thanks to the Quilts of Valor group for organizing the event.

Quilting Economic\$

It wasn't the ball that fell – it was the frames: SY (show year) 2016 is over, and SY 2017 has begun. We'll be back at Three Rivers Convention Center on March 24-25; many happy merchants will also return for a celebration of "Quilting Economic\$", selected as 2017 theme.

Show chair Laurel Sutton chose the theme in part to fulfill the "educational" half of the guild mission. "We can inform the public about how quilting and quilters influence the production, distribution, and consumption of goods and services (topics studied by the science of economics)."

Theme entries will be thrifty; the emphasis on frugality goes back to the origins of our craft. Anything you make with hand-me-downs or scraps or bargains will qualify. If you've had a scrap quilt on your bucket list, this is your year! If you don't have money for the variety of fabrics you want, or time to sew all the blocks, get a little help from your friends: organize a fabric swap or block swap in your small group.

Special exhibit entries, on the other hand, will be spendy. Anything you make that shows an extravagant investment of treasure or time or talent will qualify. Have you got some very gorgeous, expensive fabric? Have you invested heavily in beads, fibers, embellishments? If you've been reluctant to use them, this is your year! Have you got a long-term/intricate/heirloom project going? This is your year to finish! Do you have an idea that demands new skills or techniques? This is your year to cultivate your creativity.

One additional display category will be for "overdue bills" or past-due projects. Revel in your second chance for New Year's Resolutions! If you missed a challenge deadline in the past, finish your cow or moose or Jamie Fingal fabric or drunkard's path and put it in the show. If you had notions that didn't pan out in time for the 4-seasons theme, or The Story Starts at Home, or Quilters' Journey, or The Fizzy Mix of Fabric & Friends, finish your piece and put it in the show.

Crazy Quilt Landscape Workshop To Be Held May 14-15

Judith Baker Montano will travel to Richland from her home in Colorado to conduct a two-day workshop that marries her two passions – photography and fiber art.

On Friday and Saturday, May 14-15, from 9 to 5 (lunch furnished) at the Benton REA on West Van Giesen, students will turn their own seascape or landscape pictures into 8.5x11 works of fiber art. They will burn, stretch, scrunch and otherwise manipulate various types of fabric for effect. They will also learn embroidery techniques appropriate for foreground, midground, and background embellishment.

Montano's career has passed through phases of painting, quilting, and crazy quilting to embellished embroidery artwork; the one constant in her fiber pieces is the presence of luscious shades of wool yarn, silk ribbon, and lace in perfectly-executed needlework.

COMMUNITY SERVICE BLOCK MAY-JUNE 2016

Spring Strings- Makes an 8.5-inch Square UNfinished



Create a pretty community service blockand clean out your scraps--with this Spring Strings block project.

The kits will include one 8.5" muslin square, plus a 12 1/8" navy strip, cut at 1.5" at one end and 2" at the other.

You will furnish the remaining strips. This is a great way to use up left over binding, etc. Use bright colors, cutting them from 1.5" to 2" wide. They can have an angle or be on the bias.



Sewing Instructions:

Place the navy strip from one corner to the other, right side up, on the muslin square. Place a strip from your stash, right side down, along one edge of the navy strip.

Sew 1/4th inch straight seam. Be sure the strips are each cut 1" longer than you think you will need.

Flip over and press. These will all be a bit wonky.

Continue adding strips until you have covered the corner. Make sure the corner piece is at least 1" wide.

Cover the other half of the muslin block in the same manner.

Turn the block over and carefully remove the excess fabric without cutting into the muslin.













BOARD BRIEFS

March 2016

The meeting was called to order at 6:40 p.m. by President Jean Keaveney. Board Secretary Ardith Eakin took the minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Chris Cowan, Treasurer, reported that ending balances for the month of February are:

Checking \$21,762.31Money Market \$20,008.73

In response to issues regarding prompt payment, the Board approved raising the limit requiring two signatures on Guild checks to \$501.00. The Board also approved purchase of a laser printer/scanner.

Membership: Toni Jones, Membership chair, reported that the Guild has 182 members as of March 1: 149 renewals, 12 returning and 10 honorary.

AM/PM Presidents Report: Barbara Atwell asked that those who speak at Guild meetings to state their name, to assist secretaries who are taking minutes. Lois noted low attendance at the PM meeting.

Quilt Show: 2016 Show Chair, Rena Christensen reported on Show activities: a walk-through of the Convention Center, location of the main entrance, and moneybox setup. The board approved purchase of a burner phone and a Square credit card reader for show use.

Community Service: To date, about 30-35 finished CS quilts have been turned in. Chair Cyndy Underwood has purchased more batting.

Retreat: Retreat Chair Barbara Furlong asked for clarification about retreat funding. It was determined that retreats should be self-supporting--being neither a money maker nor an expense.

Workshops: Judith Baker Montano will present a workshop and AM program in May. The guild must guarantee her at least \$1500 plus expenses. The workshop is limited to 20 students and will cost \$175.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.; next board meeting will be Monday, April 11.

April 2016

The meeting was called to order at 6:33 p.m. by President Jean Keaveney. Board Secretary Ardith Eakin took the minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Chris Cowan, Treasurer, reported that ending balances for the month of March are:

Checking \$43,326.97Money Market \$20,009.07

Quilt show expenses have not all been paid; some outstanding bills remain.

Membership: Toni reported 254 members: 198 renewals, 12 new, 17 returning and 10 honorary, with 17 more memberships to process.

Newsletter/Webmaster: Cynthia Ewer reminded the Board that newsletter deadline is April 15. The board discussed some members' requests that we provide paper copies of past newsletters. As these are available on the Web site, it was decided against responding to these requests.

Quilt Show: The 2016 Quilt Show was a success, although final financials are not yet available. Silent Auction income totaled \$6733.27 with ~\$350 in expenses pending; admissions totaled \$12,844, and the merchant mall generated \$10,146. The Board reviewed a number of suggestions for future shows.

Community Service: April's program will be a CS work session, cutting scraps into usable strips and shapes. New kits--Two-Fer Fat Quarters--will allow friends to make similar but different quilts for community service.

Programs: The position for AM Program chair is open.

Publicity: A new publicity chair is needed, as former chair Laurel Sutton has resigned the position to take on the job of 2017 Quilt Show Chair.

Retreat: Retreat Chair Barbara Furlong reported that Spring retreat is ready to go. Fall Retreat will be held October 12-16 at Cove, OR.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:40 p.m.; the next TCQG board meeting will be held Monday, May 9.




