Tri-Cities Quilters Guild will be the January Featured Show at Allied Arts Gallery in Richland. Our quilts and quilted items will be on display from January 5th through January 29th. Important dates to remember are:

- Intake of quilts Monday, January 4th, 9
 - **10 am** (if you cannot bring your items in at this time please contact Barbara Minton to make alternate arrangements);
- Set up starts at 10:00 am and will continue until done.
- Quilts on exhibit January 5 29
- Public Artist Reception: Sunday, January 10 from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm
- Take down is Saturday, January 30 10 am to noon; quilts must be picked up by 12:00 pm

All TCQG members are invited to display their quilts, from bed size, wall hangings to miniatures at the Allied Arts Gallery this January.

One Featured Artist Inventory Form must be completed for all your items and is available at guild meetings, by e-mail from Barbara Minton, or at the Gallery that morning. Please fill out one form for all your items. Describe each one and list if it is for sale or not for sale (NFS) along with the price. Allied Arts will carry the insurance on each item, so you must list a price even if it is not for sale. The committee will create title cards for each piece on site and will be responsible for hanging and displaying the quilts.


Please have your name, telephone number, and price (or NFS) on the back of each item.

The Gallery will handle the sale of your item and will retain a 30% commission, so price your work accordingly. The Gallery will issue you a check within 60 days. Please consider displaying your quilt. Bring your friends and your money to the reception on January 10th to admire the Guild's artist talent.

Quilts and History Subject of November Programs

Quilting's rich history, with emphasis on Western migration and settlement, will be the subject of November's AM and PM programs, to be presented by quilt historian, curator and artist, Mary Bywater Cross. Her work focuses on making woolen quilts and researching quilt history for public presentations.



Mary is the author of:

- "Quilts and Women of the Mormon Migrations: Treasures of Transition,"
- "Treasures in the Trunk: Quilts of the Oregon Trail"




Mary is passionate about quilts as a valid document of human experience. She loves researching historic quilts, the link to the makers, and their life experience and community.

Mary will offer two different lectures during both November's AM and PM meetings, so make plans to spend the day with your fellow quilt enthusiasts:

AM Program: Treasures from the Trunk: Quilts of Migration

Placing each quilt in the context of time and place of when and where it was made and where it ended up after the migration provide key leads on the life of the maker or her family prior, during, or after migration experience.



PM Program: Patterns and Promoters: Three Early Quilt Entrepreneurs of the Colonial Revival 1890-1930

This lecture focuses on the background of the first quilt revival in the United States and describes the work of Marie Webster, Ruby Short McKim, and Carlie Sexton.

The special exhibit next April 1-2 at Quilts for All Seasons will be "Seasons in the Home" -- 4 vignettes to speak to summer, fall, winter, and spring in the home.

Will you enter? Round up a chair and an occasional table to illustrate how you create a cozy seasonal spot to indulge yourself and your fiber hobby/ hobbies. Accessorize with quilted



or handmade items plus: a glass of tea? A cup of coffee? A flower arrangement? Books and magazines that inspire you? A sample of your stitchery? A pillow or pad for your quality control animal?

Sign up with Rena for a season. Go solo or team with a friend or friends.

This exhibit will be sited front and center in the Great Hall, between the featured artists and near the harpist. The quadrants will be delineated with stanchions and velvet rope (which means, unfortunately, that you can't hang a quilt in your background. September 2015

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by President Elaine Brouillard. Board Secretary Laurel Sutton took the minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Andrea Melius, Treasurer, reported that ending balances for the month of August are:

AM/PM Presidents: Both Presidents reported that August's business meetings were cut short due to Community Service projects.

Newsletter: Editor Cynthia Ewer apologized to the Board for the late and inaccurate August newsletter, due to illness.

Membership: Paid memberships now total 264. Chair Ginny Hildreth advised the Board of issues arising when members' registration checks are sent to the wrong location. The board discussed possible solutions.

Quilt Show: Chair Rena Christensen advised the board that both guest artists want to tweak their contract in order to make presentations on both days. Karen Brun asked the board to authorize a \$100 incentive to help staff raffle quilt sales booths at community events.

Community Service: Donation total to date: 179 quilts.

Retreat: Elaine indicated that with 18 members attending, the Fall Retreat in Cove, OR is a go at the public price.

Workshops: Jo Matthias announced that she would step down from Workshop Chair as soon as a replacement is found. Upcoming

Allied Arts Exhibit: Barbara Minton will remind members to offer quilts for loan or for sale for this upcoming event.

October 2015

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by President Elaine Brouillard. Board Secretary Laurel Sutton took the minutes.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Andrea Melius indicated that bank balances were unavailable due to Web site issues; no report on finances was made.

AM/PM Presidents: Nan commented that the new format for presentations by MFA candidates, asking them to address the meeting, was effective and should be adopted in future.

Web Site: Webmaster Cynthia Ewer advised the board that Websites for Quilters, which hosts the Guild's Web site, has been sold to a new firm--which is asking for approximately \$1200 to convert the site to their system. Retreat: Elaine reported that 21 campers--including 6 new retreat members-enjoyed a wonderful retreat at Cove. Spring retreat reservations have been mad for April 20-24 at Soap Lake.

White Bluffs Makes Changes



Until now, the White Bluffs Quilt Museum has housed its dual mission of preservation and education under the same small roof. As of December, the functions will split. The museum/gallery/marketplace functions will continue to occupy the space at 294 Torbett, Richland. Classrooms, the Quilt Index Project, and archives will move to an adjacent suite. This move will essentially double the museum space.

The Museum expects this expansion in size to increase the number of visitors to the Museum. Currently over 30,000 visitors tour the museum annually. The size and significance of Museum exhibits will reflect this additional space. "We also expect an increase in the number of educational classes offered, and the size of those classes", said Jean Zoet, president of the White Bluffs Board of Directors. The additional space will provide three separate classrooms that can be reserved and rented for arts or crafts classes or other meetings. The rooms range in size, with the largest being 22 X 35, and will include tables, chairs and other classroom essentials.

White Bluffs encourages artists, teachers, and store owners to come and explore the possibilities of using this new space. White Bluffs Quilt and Fiber Art Museum presents a variation of the bed-turning with an afternoon luncheon and show of older quilts and artifacts from families of our area.
