COMMUNITY SERVICE BLOCK OF THE MONTH - January - February 2016

Blue & Green Squares

12.5" sq UNfinished

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Cut sixteen 2.5" squares from a variety of scraps, either all blue prints or all green ones.

Cut two 7" squares":

WHITE OR CREAM FOR THE BLUE BLOCKS and

SHADES OF YELLOW FOR THE GREEN.

Then cut those 7" squares in half diagonally. These will be the background triangles.



We will be handing out packets of pre-cut 2.5" squares, left over from the Blue and Green Travel Squares from a previous guild challenge. There will be more squares than you need, so pick 16 that you want to sew into a 16-patch block. They may not all be cut accurately, so lay the smaller ones in the center of a larger one and use the larger one for sewing your ¼" seam.

Note: I used darks for the corners, but that is only a suggestion.

SEWING INSTRUCTIONS:

Sew the blue or green squares into a 16-patch block. Tip: You can chain stitch the rows, press seams to one side alternately, so they will "nest".

After the 16-patch block is sewn, add the outer corners from your background triangles. They are oversized on purpose, so I can trim all the blocks to the same size before assembling the tops.

Tip: Fold each triangle in half and press a crease to align with the center seam of the 16" patch.

Sew two opposing sides, then the remaining two. Photo 3

Press open and trim off the bunny ears.

Please sew the leftover 2.5" squares in your packet into a single row strip to be used in the borders.

Press those seams in the same direction.







BOARD BRIEFS

November 2015

The meeting was called to order at 6:35 p.m. by President Elaine Brouillard. Board Secretary Laurel Sutton took the minutes. New Board members were welcomed, and officer materials distributed.

Treasurer's Report: Andrea Melius, Treasurer, reported that ending balances for the month of August are:

 Checking \$11,708.89 \$4992.17 Savings • Money Market \$20,007.40

Andrea noted that the bank charges \$3 per month to provide a paper statement for a savings account, which exceeds interest earned. The Board voted to close the account and transfer funds to the checking account. Board members were advised that the 2016 budget will need to be approved by the membership at the upcoming Annual Meeting.

AM/PM Presidents: While Monique Kleinhans' trunk show was inspiring and interesting, meeting attendees were saddened at the news of the loss of member Pat Merkel.

Newsletter/Web site: As local mail must travel to and from Spokane for sorting, snail mail editions of the newsletter are taking longer to be delivered. Work on a new Web site continues, with launch date to take place after the April Quilt Show.

Quilt Show: Chair Rena Christensen reported that Desert Fiber Arts will display their craft at the Quilt Show, and discussed setting aside an area of the show to honor members who have died.

Retreat: Barbara Furlong has agreed to serve as Retreat Chair.

Workshops: Jo Matthias announced that the tuffet class was well-received ... and broke even.

Allied Arts Exhibit: Barbara Minton will remind members to offer quilts for loan or for sale for this upcoming event.

The next Board meeting will be held Monday, December 7 at 6:30 p.m. at White Bluffs Center, 294 Torbett in Richland, WA.

December 2015

The meeting was called to order at 6:38 p.m. by President Elaine Brouillard. Board Secretary Laurel Sutton took the minutes.

Secretary's Report: After discussion, the Board decided not to change the date of the Web site password change from March 1 to January 1.

Treasurer's Report: Andrea presented the results of the budget committee, which met to draft a balanced budget for 2016. After discussion, the Board added \$385 to the category for meeting venues, to cover new costs from White Bluffs. Admission to the Quilt Show will be raised to \$8. The Board approved the budget; it will be presented to the general membership for approval at the 2015 Annual Meeting on December 12. Finally, the Board approved a motion to appoint a committee to investigate retaining a bookkeeping service; the committee will report at the March meeting.

Membership: Paid memberships now total 275.

Quilt Show: Raffle quilt ticket sales have topped 1200 to date. Wendy Ball offered a quilt for the 2017 raffle; the board accepted happily.

Community Service: 255 quilts have been delivered to date in 2015, including four quilts given to a Habitat family. The Board approved \$200 to be used to purchase blender fabrics for the Fabric Closet. Finally, a big backlog of donated tops will require purchase of batting in the coming year; all quilters, machine or domestic machine, are needed to help finish these quilt tops.

Retreat: Barbara Furlong has jumped into her new position with energy; she will assemble and bring CS kits to retreats.

Workshops: Four major artists are under consideration for 2016 and 2017.

AM/PM Programs: Carol Shoaf will demonstrate use of Seta Color paints at January's meetings; in February, a "Three Corners" program will cover non-traditional tools and methods for quilting.

The next Board meeting will be held Monday, November 9 at 6:30 p.m. at White Bluffs Center, 294 Torbett in Richland, WA.


