Workshop instructor June Jaeger will give us a glimpse into her craft at the regular Guild meetings in April.

Jaeger was born and raised in Central Oregon, at the foot of the Ochoco Mountains, where the juniper trees and pine trees meet. In 1969 she was introduced to quilting by her sister, Jean Wells Keenan, owner of the The Stitchin' Post. In 1993, she opened her own quilt store, Log Cabin Quiltworks, in Pendleton, later relocating the business to Prineville,

Members and guests can make a block to take home or donate to community service. Volunteer to assist. She's at #149 on the volunteer list.
